

# Cricklewood Community Micro-Commissions Info

**On October 3rd** there's going to be a community festival at Clitterhouse Farm Project called a Fun Palace, you can find more info about Fun Palaces here: <https://funpalaces.co.uk/>

A Fun Palace is all about celebrating the genius in everyone and one of our volunteers has received funding from Arts Council England to give out some small pots of money to enable people in the local area to share their talents and enthusiasms.

We are looking for people with some kind of creative practice, this could be artistic or scientific, as long as it has a creative angle. It could be anything from a style of dance to using science to make jewellery. Then we want to give these people a small pot of money to help them share that skill with the rest of the community at the Fun Palace on October 3rd in the form of a workshop / class outdoors.

## What should the workshop be like?

- Last no more than 45 minutes
- Be repeatable (Due to the COVID restriction we may ask you to do the workshop a couple of times for smaller groups)
- Follow the government rules on COVID-secure activity: <https://www.gov.uk/coronavirus>
- Share your creative practice with other members of the community
- Be able to be done outside
- Be able to adapt to an online version if there's bad weather (we can help you with this if you need equipment)

## What are we looking for?

We're looking for people who:

- Live in / are local to Cricklewood
- Want to deepen or begin a relationship with Clitterhouse Farm Project
- Want to develop their creative practice

## What do you get?

You can apply for £100 - £200, we expect at least £100 of this time goes into paying for your labour then there is some flexibility for expenses, send an email if you want help with this.

We also have funding to provide 3 development sessions for the group of people delivering workshops, we'll work with the people who get commissions to decide what kind of new skills they want to learn and then find professionals to deliver some training. They could be in anything from "how to manage a creative project" to "How to find funding for your practice".

You'll also get support from the Clitterhouse Farm Project team to organise your workshop, so if you haven't done this before, we can help!
